A Transformed Africa by the Power of God's Word

If you could plant a church in Africa, would you?



Apostle George Apasera

You may not have the calling to plant a church in Africa, but you and we have the opportunity to provide help and encouragement to our African brothers who do have this calling. Let me introduce you to Apostle George Apasera, who operates three Bible schools in Ghana with a total of 62 students and has been a long-time AABS member. His vision is to reach the rural areas of northern Ghana and on into the nearby Muslim-majority countries of Burkina Faso (52%) and Niger (97%). But unfortunately, due in part to the pandemic and the subsequent closure of country borders, he currently cannot travel there.

In the past twenty years his ministry has been planting churches and they have also recently roofed six village churches that were worshipping under trees. To date, Apostle Apasera and his ministry have planted 52 churches in Ghana, with nearly all of these being in the northern half of the country, where Muslims comprise 40% or more of the population and many others are idol worshippers. Most of these churches are among least reached tribes, such as the Wala and Lobi, which have only 1.5% and 2% evangelical Christians, respectively. In addition, 3 churches have been planted in Burkina Faso and 5 in Niger. He also is endeavoring to begin AABS member Bible schools in these countries so that he can train leaders and workers for the churches.
