## AABS Highlights from 2025!!!

As we reflect on 2025, we give thanks to God for a year marked by growth, unity, and expanding global impact through the work of the **All-nations Association of Bible Schools (AABS)**. This year has been especially significant as AABS strengthened its leadership, deepened prayer partnerships, and extended its presence across Africa and beyond.

In November, **JC traveled to Mozambique**, meeting with the leaders of the Makua Project, a group of more than 120,000 Muslim-background believers and 1,923 churches who are looking for ways to train their leaders. That same month, **Tim traveled to India and Bangladesh**, where AABS connected with associated Bible schools, explored future partnerships, and laid groundwork for expanded collaboration in South Asia. These trips reflect AABS's growing global vision and commitment to supporting sound biblical training wherever God opens doors.



A major milestone in 2025 was the formation of the **AABS Accreditation Commission**. This commission represents an important step forward in ensuring excellence, integrity, and consistency in Bible school education. The commission will provide the option of accreditation for those schools who are interested or are required to be accredited by their national governments.

Prayer continued to be central to the life and mission of AABS. **Prayer team leaders from several international AABS teams met weekly by Zoom**, faithfully interceding for schools, students, leaders, and nations. These regular prayer gatherings strengthened unity across borders and reminded us that lasting fruit comes through dependence on God.



Throughout the year, **national conferences were held in eleven countries**, providing opportunities for training, encouragement, and strategic planning among Bible school leaders. These gatherings fostered collaboration and helped align schools with the mission and values of AABS.

In 2025, AABS also celebrated the appointment of **two new National Directors: Apostle Gideon Imasuen in Ivory Coast and Dr. James Tembula in Kenya**. Dr. Tembula played a key role in expanding awareness of AABS, **presenting the ministry to approximately 2,000 pastors at a leaders conference in Kenya**. Additionally, **Rev. James Odoom** represented AABS in meetings with church leaders in **Senegal and The Gambia**, opening new doors for partnership and future training schools.

Another significant moment in 2025 was the appointment of **Pastor Joshua Tuffour as AABS Africa Director**. Pastor Tuffour has served AABS faithfully for 16 years in various capacities, and this appointment recognizes both his proven leadership and his heart for biblical education across the continent. His new role positions AABS for greater coordination, vision, and impact across the continent of Africa.
